The five members of the Library Board are governed by the California State Education Code, and are responsible for enforcing all the rules, regulations, and bylaws necessary for the administration, governance and protection of the library and its property. The Board meets on the fourth Thursday of each month at 7:00 P.M. in the Monroe Room of the Community Center, 119 West Palm Avenue. Boardmembers may not be a City of Monrovia employee and must be a Monrovia resident.

The five member Board is comprised of Old Town merchants and is responsible for making recommendations to the City Council on programs and projects to advance the downtown area through marketing, promotion and overall improvement of the Business Improvement District. The MOTAB meets once a month on the second Tuesday of each month at 9:30 A.M. in Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue. Boardmembers may not be a City of Monrovia employee, must have a bona fide business in the Old Town district that is subject to the Business Improvement District (BID) assessment, and must be current on their BID assessment.

The seven members of the Planning Commission are the decision-making body on zone variances, conditional use permits, design reviews and parcel maps. However, a decision made by the Commission may be appealed to the City Council within 10 days of the decision. The Commission also acts in an advisory capacity to the City Council on matters involving the City's General Plan, Specific Plans, zoning or planning ordinances, and subdivision tract maps. The Planning Commission meets once a month on the Wednesday following the second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 P.M. in Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue. Commissioners may not be a City of Monrovia employee and must be a Monrovia resident.

The seven members of the Monrovia Historic Preservation Commission protect and preserve Monrovia's historic landmarks. Commission members shall be appointed from among professionals in the disciplines of architecture, history, architectural history, planning, or other historic preservation-related disciplines, such as urban planning, American studies, American civilization, cultural geography, or cultural anthropology, to the extent that such professionals are available in the community. Commission membership shall also include other persons who have demonstrated special interest, knowledge, or experience in the history, architecture or cultural heritage of Monrovia as will provide for an adequate and qualified Commission. The Historic Preservation Commission meets quarterly on the Wednesday following the fourth Tuesday (January, April, July, and October) at 7:30 P.M. in Council Chambers, 415 South Ivy Avenue. Commissioners may not be a City of Monrovia employee and must be a Monrovia resident.

Pursuant to: Government Code 54972. On or before December 31 of each year, each legislative body shall prepare an appointments list of all regular and ongoing boards, commissions, and committees which are appointed by the legislative body of the local agency. This list shall be known as the Local Appointments List. The list shall contain the following information: (a) A list of all appointive terms which will expire during the next calendar year, with the name of the incumbent appointee, the date of appointment, the date the term expires, and the necessary qualifications for the position; (b) A list of all boards, commissions, and committees whose members serve at the pleasure of the legislative body, and the necessary qualifications for each position.
