## **MAYOR PRO TEM SPICER'S MOTHER PASSES AWAY, SERVICES SCHEDULED FOR SATURDAY, JANUARY 23, 2016, AT 1:00 P.M.**

On Tuesday, January 12, 2016, Geneva Monroe Spicer, mother to Mayor Pro Tem Larry Spicer, passed away. Born April 26, 1931, Mrs. Spicer was a 62 year resident of Monrovia, having moved to our community in 1954. Having been bestowed the title of Mother Spicer by Second Baptist Church of Monrovia, Mrs. Spicer was an active member of the community and also served faithfully as a foster care parent for Los Angeles County.

Services for Mrs. Spicer are scheduled to be held on Saturday, January 23, 2016, at Second Baptist Church (925 South Shamrock Avenue, Monrovia) at 1:00 p.m., and our thoughts and prayers are with the entire Spicer family during this difficult time.

## **PRESENTATION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT STANDARD ADJUSTMENTS PURSUANT TO OUR NEIGHBORHOOD STUDY SET TO BEGIN STARTING JANUARY 25, 2016**

Based on concerns about the potential impact of new development on the character of Monrovia's neighborhoods, the City has been engaged in an extensive review of our current development regulations. Over the past year, numerous community meetings, commission deliberations, and City Council assessments have been coordinated to discuss concerns related to new development.

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With the input received, City staff has developed an outline of proposed modifications to our development standards. However, prior to presenting the proposed adjustments to the Planning Commission and City Council for formal review and consideration, a series of community meetings have been scheduled to review the proposed adjustments.

The first meeting we have coordinated is targeted to receive feedback from interested realtors, brokers, and developers. That meeting has been scheduled to take place on **Monday, January 25, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. at Monrovia City Hall (415 South Ivy Avenue, Monrovia).**

Additional outreach meetings are being coordinated pursuant to the following tentative schedule:

- Thursday, January 28, 2016 @ 7:00 p.m. – MOHPG Meeting at the Monrovia Public Library in the Community Room
- Monday, February 1, 2016 @ 7:00 p.m. – General Community Meeting / MAP at the Monrovia Public Library in the Community Room

Following those outreach meeting sessions, staff will be presenting the feedback received on our proposed development standard modifications to the City Council and the Planning Commission at the following Study Session meetings:

- Tuesday, February 2, 2016 @ 6:00 p.m. – City Council Study Session at Monrovia City Hall
- Wednesday, February 10, 2016 @ 6:00 p.m. – Planning Commission Study Session at Monrovia City Hall

Finally, after obtaining additional feedback from the City Council and the Planning Commission in a Study Session format, we plan on coordinating formal consideration and public hearings regarding the proposed development standard adjustments pursuant to the following schedule:

- Formal Planning Commission Review – March 9, 2016
- City Council, First Reading – April 5, 2016
- City Council, Second Reading – April 19, 2016
- Effective date of new development standards – May 19, 2016 (Construction Moratorium Repeal Date)

## **EWMP WATER BOARD MEETING RECAP**

Last week, the Rio Hondo / San Gabriel River Watershed EWMP Group, of which Monrovia is a member, hosted a meeting with representatives from the State Water Resources Control Board. The meeting was designed to allow our EWMP group an opportunity to discuss issues related to the implementation of stormwater treatment projects associated with our overall MS4 permit. As you may recall, based on initial cost estimates, the identified projects associated with coming into compliance with our MS4 Permit total \$1.4 billion for our overall EWMP group, and \$214.15 million for the City of Monrovia.

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Council Member Crudginton attended the meeting with staff, and while good dialogue occurred during the meeting, the representatives from the State Water Resources Control Board were unapologetic about the implications that we face in complying with the provisions of our MS4 Permit, which mandate the completion of significant capital projects by 2017. Furthermore, it is our sense that even under the best case realistic scenario regarding progress that we can make during the next few months, the indications we received from the State Water Resources Control Board staff point to a situation where we will likely be at odds with the State regarding this particular matter moving forward. We will continue to work on managing this process, and will of course be certain to keep everyone apprised of our progress moving forward.

## **THAT'S A WRAP – HISTORIC SANTA FE DEPOT FENCING WRAP INSTALLED LAST WEEK!**

As we continue to make preparations for the opening of Station Square Park, our team installed a wrapped fence around the Historic Santa Fe Depot last week. As the photo below illustrates, the fence we installed has a wonderful wrap that provides both practical and aesthetic value. From a practical perspective, with Station Square Park set to be open later this week, we wanted to be sure to secure the Historic Santa Fe Depot once the area is open to the public. In addition, given that the development team over at Daylight Limited, LLC, is working on rehabilitating the Historic Santa Fe Depot, and since the proposed renovation timeline will last through late 2016, we wanted to be sure to give the fence a bit of aesthetic value.



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## **MONROVIA POLICE DEPARTMENT NOW ON NEXTDOOR.COM**

Last week, the Monrovia Police Department established a presence on Nextdoor.com. We engaged this new communication mechanism after receiving an increasing number of public safety related questions through the social media medium. We plan on using Nextdoor.com to share information on crime prevention, safety, public events, and emergency notifications. It is important to note, however, that we established our presence on Nextdoor.com in such a way that the Monrovia Police Department staff will **not** be able to see any of the content posted on neighborhood sites, except for the direct replies to City posts. Furthermore, we would like to note that Nextdoor.com is not the appropriate way to request emergency services, police services, report criminal / suspicious activity, or file a report. Rather, we established the presence on Nextdoor.com in an effort to build stronger, safer neighborhoods throughout Monrovia.

As a reminder, the storm season is just beginning and the City has sandbags available for all residents and businesses at the following locations:

- Public Services Corporate Yard (600 S. Mountain Avenue, from 7:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday)
- Community Center (119 W Palm Ave from 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday; and 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. on Friday)
- Monrovia Fire Station 101 (141 East Lemon Avenue) and Fire Station 102 (2055 South Myrtle Avenue)
- *Please note... residents may request up to 25 bags per resident, however, special circumstances may allow for the distribution of additional bags*

Gravel collection is available on a self-service basis (residents need to bring a shovel, safety goggles, and gloves) for resident use in a containers located at the following places:

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- 900 Block of Crescent (between Madison and El Nido)
- 352 Hill Street (North-East corner of Hill Street and Prospect Avenue)
- Recreation Park (near Barney Glen Baseball Field Parking Lot)
- *Please note... City staff will be on-call and available to help with filling gravel bags for residents in need of assistance. Please call (626) 932-5575 for additional information.*

## About the Homeless Count

### REQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Q How does counting homeless persons help to reduce and end homelessness?**  
**A** We need to know the size and scope of homelessness throughout Los Angeles County. In order to make a difference in the lives of our homeless residents, we need to know who they are and where they reside; the count is really secondary to our goal of helping homeless persons find permanent housing. The data gathered from the count allows us to assess how and where homeless persons can best be served.

**Q I've never done this before. How will I know how to count homeless people?**  
**A** All volunteers will be fully trained and provided with equipment and materials.

**Q Can I select which area I want to volunteer in?**  
**A** Yes! We encourage volunteers to count in the community they are most familiar with! Visit [www.TheyCountWillYou.org](http://www.TheyCountWillYou.org) to register and indicate your area preference.

**Q What is the time commitment and expected schedule for the Homeless Count?**  
**A** Please reference the left sidebar for scheduling, but the time commitment is generally 3-5 hours for most volunteer roles on the day/night of the Count. However, if you would like to also volunteer before and after the Count, please let us know when you register.

**Q What will I be doing as a volunteer?**  
**A** There are many ways you can participate to help make the Homeless Count a success. Volunteering opportunities include:

- **Volunteer Trainers** to be responsible for training all Volunteer Counters at a specific deployment site for up to 4 hours on the day/night of the Count. Trainers take on a leadership role and must be comfortable giving direction.
- **Volunteer Counters, Drivers or Navigators** to receive training and materials on the day of the Count from trained volunteers and be deployed in groups of 2 - 4 to count specific blocks in an area. Each position will be outside counting for up to 4 hours.
- **Office Volunteers** making phone calls to recruit volunteers; helping with data entry; providing support at Headquarters. Shifts of 2-4 hours on the night of the Count. You can also decide if you want to volunteer before, during and/or after the Count.
- **Special Outreach Teams** are individuals familiar with remote areas and marginalized communities. These volunteers include subpopulation specialists, law enforcement and park rangers. They are also responsible for verifying tally sheets on the morning or night of the count. Shifts vary.

**Q Can I invite others to join?**  
**A** Yes! Once your registered, you can invite as many people as you would like by simply sending them the deployment site registration link.

**Q Can minors volunteer?**  
**A** Yes! Youth 17 years and younger can sign up at Headquarters' office volunteers to work before during and/or after the Count. On the night of the Count they can also work 2-4 hours at a deployment site. Youth can not participate as street count volunteers.

## **WASHINGTON, D.C. UPDATE FROM TURCH AND ASSOCIATES**
