DIRECTLY ELECTED MAYOR VS. ROTATIONAL MAYOR – PUBLIC OUTREACH SCHEDULE ESTABLISHED

Recently, the Monrovia City Council unanimously requested that staff look into the City's established process for selecting the Mayor. Currently, the City utilizes a directly elected Mayor governance structure where the Mayor is elected once every two years in odd-numbered years. However, the vast majority of cities similar to Monrovia rotate the position of Mayor amongst the members of the elected City Council.

In fact, a survey that was recently completed illustrates that 78% of cities in the San Gabriel Valley with a population of under 100,000 people utilize a governance structure whereby the position of Mayor is rotated between all members of the City Council.

As part of the review process, the City created a Directly Elected Mayor Advisory Review Committee (Committee) to assist with the assessment of our current system of selecting the Mayor. The Committee is made up of individuals from a wide cross-section of Monrovia and includes a former city manager, two current elected officials, the executive director of a chamber of commerce, and a member of a City commission. The individuals on the committee include:

- Steve Baker, current Elected City Treasurer & City Historian
- Don Hopper, former City Manager
- Karen MacNair, current Chamber Executive Director
- Joanne Montgomery, current Elected Citrus College Board of Trustee Member
- Brian Ulm, current City Community Services Commission Member

During the past several months, the Committee has met a few times to assess different options available to the City. Based on the work that has been coordinated to date, a series of public outreach meetings have been scheduled to provide additional information regarding the overall situation, and to solicit feedback regarding the proposal to change the way that Monrovia selects its Mayor.

To that end, the outreach meetings have been scheduled to take place as follows:

As part of the outreach effort, City staff will also be meeting with all City Boards and Commissions during the next several weeks to discuss the proposed transition from having a directly elected Mayor to a system of governance where the position of Mayor is rotated between members of the elected City Council.

As these outreach meetings occur, it is important to note... the decision regarding whether or not we will change the way that we select the Mayor is not a decision that can be made by the City. Ultimately, the voters of Monrovia will have to decide if it makes sense to transition our governance structure from a directly elected Mayor to one where the position of Mayor rotates between the elected members of the City Council.

SPECIAL JOINT MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION SCHEDULED FOR JUNE 20, 2016 AT 7:00 P.M.

During the past few months, in response to mansionization concerns in the community, staff has been working to analyze and refine different options related to updating both our development standards and our historic preservation ordinance. To this point in time, the public discussions have centered primarily on refinements to our development standards, and we have engaged a number of different mechanisms related to that particular review.

Simultaneous to the work that has been coordinated to update our development standards has been an in-depth assessment of our overall historic preservation ordinance. With one of the most robust historic preservation programs in the San Gabriel Valley, we are certainly proud of the fact that we have 137 landmarked facilities here in Monrovia! The current discussions related to mansionization concerns has given us an opportunity to reassess our overall historic preservation program, and based on the work that has been completed to date, we have developed a series of options for consideration.

In order to provide an appropriate venue for an initial review of those options, we have coordinated a joint Study Session meeting of the City Council and the Historic Preservation Commission to take place on Monday, June 20, 2016, at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. Please feel free to come be part of the discussion regarding this important topic.

RAW INSPIRATION CONTRACT DISCUSSIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE CITY'S WEEKLY STREET FAIR EVENT CONTINUING

Just a quick note to let everyone know that staff has had additional discussions this past week with representatives from Raw Inspiration regarding coordination of our Friday Night Family Street Fair event. The conversation went well and based on our discussions to date, we do believe that an overall Franchise Agreement will be ready for City Council consideration on June 21, 2016.

CITY TOWING SERVICES CONTRACT OUT TO BID

We recently issued an RFP for the City's towing services contract, given that our current agreement with Foothill Towing is scheduled to expire on June 30, 2016. As part of the RFP, we required that the selected operator maintain a business office and a storage and impound lot here in Monrovia in order to provide our residents who have had their vehicles towed with easier access to retrieve a towed vehicle. COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMISSION BEGINS TOURS OF OTHER COMMUNITY CENTERS AS PART OF NEEDS ASSESSMENT REVIEW

During the past several weeks, staff has been coordinating an overall needs assessment review of the City's Community Center facility with the Community Services Commission (Commission). As part of the review, the Commission has assessed our current facility programming needs, reviewed deficiencies with the current Community Center, and also considered additional refinements that should be made to the building.

In an effort to conduct a complete thorough review, staff has also worked with the Commission to begin touring community centers in other communities. This past week, representatives from the Commission, Council Member Spicer (who serves as the City Council liaison to the Commission), and staff all participated in a tour of the Arcadia and Duarte community centers. In the coming weeks, additional tours will be conducted of other community center facilities located in the San Gabriel Valley, and we hope to complete this initial needs assessment review within the next few months.

PARK MASTER PLAN – REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATION (RFQ)

On June 6, 2016, the City issued a RFQ for qualified firms or consultants to help update our Park Master Plan and Recreation / Open Space Element of the General Plan. A copy of that RFQ has been uploaded to our website at the link below for your review and reference. The City has a strong commitment to providing premier park facilities and programs for our citizens and this plan should guide the development of parks as we move into the future.

UPDATES ON THE MONROVIA HIGH SCHOOL POOL

During the past several weeks, the School District has been making improvements to the High School Pool. Repairs that are being coordinated include lighting, tile, and re-plastering related enhancements. Furthermore, all of the identified improvements are necessary to meet the Health Department standards.

Unfortunately, due to several project delays, the plaster project will not begin until June 20, 2016. As a result of the delay, all of the identified work is not expected to be completed until August 2016.

So you think you know about Monrovia? But do you really?


For instance, do you know...

AQMD LEAF BLOWER EXCHANGE PROGRAM NOW UP AND RUNNING!

Last week, the South Coast AQMD notified us that their Leaf Blower Exchange Program was now accepting registration for those interested in exchange their gas powered leaf blower for a battery powered zero emission model!

The 2016 Commercial Leaf Blower Exchange Program is offering another opportunity to exchange a commercial gasoline-powered backpack leaf blower for a zero emission, battery-powered STIHL blower. There are two models to choose from, including the BGA 85 battery-powered, hand-held blower, which is a \$200 with trade-in and includes the battery and rapid charger. In addition, the BGA 100 hand-held blower is \$600 with trade-in and includes the AR 900 backpack lithium-ion battery and high speed charger.

Pre-registration is required to secure your exchange date and location. There are three different dates in July 2016 and six locations to choose from. Trade in your current backpack blower (**must be fully operational**) and replace it with a new STIHL BGA 100 kit or BGA 85 kit for the SCAQMD-subsidized price of only \$200 or \$600 (depending upon model selected). Supplies are limited. You must pre-register for one of the exchange events listed below. Reservations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Each gardening / landscaping business, city / county government, school district, or college can exchange up to 5 working blowers.

When you call to register, we will ask for your name, address, phone number, the exchange location / date of your choice, the number of working blowers you intend to exchange and the model(s) you wish to replace them with. You will be given a confirmation number and a time slot to arrive at the event. Your reservation will only be good for the day and location of the event you choose. Your reservation will be canceled if you do not arrive within two hours of your scheduled time. Cash and major credit cards will be accepted at the events.

To qualify for the blower exchange, you must:

- Be a professional gardener / landscaper, city / county government, school district, or college.
- Live and work within the SCAQMD's 4-county jurisdiction. This includes most of Los Angeles County (excluding the Antelope Valley), all of Orange County, most of Riverside County, and non-desert San Bernardino County.
