NEIGHBORHOOD COMPATIBILITY DEVELOPMENT STANDARD THREE-DIMENSIONAL MODELING UPDATE

Based on direction received from both the City Council and Planning Commission, our Community Development Department is now working on several items associated with the proposed neighborhood compatibility single family development standards update. In addition to initiating work to draft the actual proposed ordinance language, staff this past week engaged a new revised “autopsy” process working in partnership with Planning Commissioner Coulter Winn.

Starting with the property located at 122 North Alta Vista, we have designed a unique review process that is much more involved than simply having staff anticipate what the redesigned project might look like assuming that our proposed development standard revisions were in place. Instead, we have asked Commissioner Winn to serve as the “applicant” for a hypothetical project at 122 North Alta Vista, and staff will review his “proposed project” utilizing the new building envelope, building size, and compatibility / design review authorities included in the draft development standards update.

Pursuant to this proposed autopsy process, the home at 122 North Alta Vista as currently constructed will serve as Commissioner Winn's first submittal, and staff will analyze the submittal and provide feedback regarding building and design modifications that need to be made. As part of this exercise, Commissioner Winn has agreed to build a 3-dimensional model of each submittal he makes based on comments / feedback provided by our planning staff so that we can track the evolution of the design of the house. Ultimately, this proposed autopsy process of 122 North Alta Vista constitutes a much more authentic review than simply having staff present what we think the proposed development standards would create at the location.

Many thanks to our Planning Division team for their tremendous work in managing the overall issues related to neighborhood compatibility and historic preservation – we are making progress towards solving those issues here in Monrovia, and the work of our team is certainly to be commended!

BUILDING PERMIT PULLED FOR APARTMENT PROJECT LOCATED AT FIFTH AND HUNTINGTON

Last week, the development firm building the 5th and Huntington residential apartment project located at the southeast corner of Fifth Avenue and Huntington Drive pulled their final building permits. This means that the project is moving full speed ahead and that the developer will be starting construction on the project within the next month or so.

The housing project has been a long time coming and will replace the former self-storage facility with a new four-story, 154-unit apartment complex, along with a small 1,340 square foot commercial space at the north corner of the building. HISTORIC SANTA FE DEPOT LANDMARK PROCESS –HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION SET TO CONSIDER THE MATTER ON MARCH 23, 2016

CITY'S MONROVIA AREA PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM SELECTED AS A FINALIST FOR THREE NEIGHBORHOOD, USA PROGRAM CATEGORIES

Last week, the City was notified by the national non-profit organization Neighborhood, USA (NUSA), that the elements of the City's Monrovia Area Partnership (MAP) program are being considered as finalists for three NUSA award categories! Our Neighborhood Services Division is to be commended for their tremendous work that resulted in the recognition from NUSA for the following categories:

- Youth Program Award: MAP Youth Leadership Academy
- Neighborhood Program Award: MAP Care for your Neighbor Program
- Newsletter Program Award: MAP Newsletter

NUSA is a national non-profit organization committed to building and strengthening neighborhood organizations. Created in 1975 to share information and experiences used to build stronger communities, NUSA continues to encourage networking and information-sharing to facilitate the development of partnerships among neighborhood organizations, government, and the private sector for the ultimate goal of strengthening every neighborhood.

NATIONAL RECREATION AREA LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

During the past few months, staff has been corresponding primarily with representatives from Congress Member Napolitano's office regarding the National Recreation Area (NRA) legislation, which is contained in House Resolution (HR) 3820 – San Gabriel Mountains, Foothills and River Protection Act (Bill). In those conversations, we have been able to illustrate for Congress Member Napolitano's staff how the proposed measure would include a huge swath of Monrovia by plotting our City boundaries over the proposed NRA area. This was accomplished by utilizing our internal GIS capabilities, and a copy of the map that the City developed can be accessed by clicking on the following link:

If you click on the link above, the map includes areas shaded in green, red, and blue. Those color designations refer to the following items:

- The area shaded in green outlines the boundaries of the existing San Gabriel Mountains National Monument.
- The areas shaded in red outlines the proposed expansion area for the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument contemplated in the proposed NRA Bill.
- The area shaded in blue outlines the proposed San Gabriel Mountains National Recreation Area proposed in the NRA Bill.

As we have engaged in these discussions, staff has informed Congress Member Napolitano's Office that the City Council has taken a formal position requesting that Monrovia be removed from the boundaries of the NRA Bill. As we have had those discussions with our federal legislative representatives, staff was told that if the NRA Bill was advanced through the Natural Resources Subcommittee on Federal Lands to either a committee hearing or committee mark-up, Congress Member Napolitano would consider requesting that Monrovia be removed from the boundaries of the NRA Bill. However, Congress Member Napolitano's staff also informed the City that it was very unlikely that the NRA Bill would be advanced to a committee hearing or committee mark-up process, as there was very little support for the measure in the House of Representatives.

This past week, Congress Member Napolitano's staff reached out to the City to let us know that the NRA Bill is still sitting in committee and that there does not seem to be any interest by the Natural Resources Subcommittee on Federal Lands – or by the House of Representatives for that matter – to consider the NRA Bill in 2016. Staff will continue to monitor the situation and we will most certainly let everyone know if the situation changes moving forward.




