

NEW SCE POLES COMING TO YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD


This week, the Public Services Department will be issuing an encroachment permit to Southern California Edison (SCE) to begin a large-scale maintenance program in Monrovia regarding replacement of power poles. In the coming weeks and months, SCE will be working to replace two-hundred and fourteen (214) 50-year old power poles with new steel poles throughout the community. SCE has stipulated that their goal is to replace 20 poles per day, and the map attached below outlines both the project phasing and location of each pole that will be replaced.

As part of the encroachment permit approval process, the City requested and SCE agreed to notify any resident that could be impacted by the work, and door hangers will be placed at every residence where disruptions could occur. Also, it is important to note that the work being proposed by SCE is not related to the overall Monrovia Renewal capital improvement initiative. However, by having SCE complete the work now prior to any City-initiated street construction, damage to the new roads from the heavy equipment will be minimized.

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GOVERNOR ISSUES NEW EXECUTIVE ORDER B-37-16 REVISING WATER CONSERVATION MANDATES, NEW CONSERVATION LIMITS EXPECTED TO BE ESTABLISHED IN EARLY 2017

Last week, Governor Brown issued Executive Order B-37-16. Pursuant to the order, it appears that between June 2015 – March 2016, water use in California was reduced by 23.9%, and given the advances that have been made, the State is looking to develop new and less restrictive water conservation standards.

Pursuant to the Executive Order that was issued, the State Water Board is now required to develop by January 2017 new proposals for achieving additional reductions in water usage. Furthermore, by January 10, 2017, both the State Water Board and the Department of Water Resources are required to establish new targets that will build upon requirement (SB 7), which mandates a 20% reduction in urban water usage by 2020. The analysis will look to make additional regulations regarding the following items:

- Indoor residential per capita water use
- Outdoor irrigation
- Commercial, industrial, and institutional water use
- Water lost through leaks

Based on the new regulations, staff will be interfacing with the Upper San Gabriel Basin Watermaster to begin the process of determining what water conservation levels should look like here in Monrovia. That work will continue for the next several months, and we should be ready to bring back for City Council consideration in early 2017 proposed water conservation regulation updates. In the meantime, we should all continue to do our part to build on the great work that Monrovia has accomplished to date by engaging conservation efforts wherever possible. DIRECTLY ELECTED MAYOR ADVISORY REVIEW COMMITTEE MEETING UPDATE

Last Monday, May 16, 2016, the Directly Elected Mayor Advisory Review Committee (Committee) met again to discuss next steps in our overall assessment regarding the proposed transition to a rotating Mayor system of governance. As you may recall, the City is working to assess if it makes sense to rotate the position of Mayor amongst City Council members, as opposed to having a Mayor directly elected by the community.

Ultimately, the voters of Monrovia will have to decide if such a change makes sense, and to help assist with analyzing the issue, the City created the Committee, whose members includes Don Hopper, Steve Baker, Karen MacNair, Joanne Montgomery, and Brian Ulm.

Based on the discussion at the meeting, the Committee has asked staff to coordinate a series of outreach meetings with the community to solicit community feedback regarding the proposed change in how we select the Mayor. Staff will be coordinating those meetings, and in the next week or two, we will be publishing an outreach meeting schedule.

In addition, for your reference, attached below is a document which outlines the results of a survey that staff conducted regarding how cities in the SGV select their Mayor. Of particular note, the survey outlined that for those cities with a population of under 100,000 people, 78% of those communities (21 out of 27 cities) do not directly elect their Mayor, and instead, rotate the appointment between members of the City Council.

Moving forward, we will be certain to keep everyone apprised of any updates regarding this process, and as soon as we refine the outreach meeting schedule with the Committee, we will be certain to share with everyone what those meeting dates are!

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ANNUAL WATER AND SEWER CPI ADJUSTMENT SCHEDULED TO OCCUR IN JULY 2016

We wanted to let everyone know that as part of the water and sewer rate schedule that was adopted by the City on October 6, 2015, every July 1st (from July 1, 2016 through July 1, 2020), a CPI adjustment will be made to our overall water and sewer rates that customers will see beginning with their August 2016 bill. Pursuant to the adopted fee schedule, the CPI adjustment amount will be equal to the annual percentage increase in the Construction Cost Index (CCI) as provided by the Engineering News-Record reported for March 1. Staff has reviewed the CCI for March 2016, which identifies an increase of 2.7%.

Attached below is the Municipal Services Bill insert that will be mailed out regarding this upcoming July 1, 2016 water and sewer rate CPI adjustment. For the typical residential customer, a 2.7% CPI rate adjustment will result in a \$1.05 / month water bill increase, and a \$0.24 / month sewer bill increase. In addition, the overall revised rates with a 2.7% increase amount is outlined in the table below.

Annual Water and Sewer Rate CPI
Adjustments Take Effect July 1, 2016**

As part of the water and sewer rate schedule that was adopted by the City on October 20, 2015, an annual CPI adjustment tied to the Construction Cost Index will be made to our water and sewer rates every July 1, from July 1, 2016 through July 1, 2020. Pursuant to the adopted fee schedule, the CPI adjustment that will be implemented effective July 1, 2016 is a +2.7% modification.

For the typical residential customer, a 2.7% CPI rate adjustment will result in a \$1.05/month water bill increase, and a \$0.24/month sewer bill increase. Customers will see the new service charges effective with their August 2016 Municipal Services Bill pursuant to the tables below.

The water and sewer rate adjustments approved on October 20, 2015 are being reinvested into the community through the Monrovia Renewal Program.

Monrovia Renewal is a multi-year initiative that will make priority repairs to aging infrastructure across the city. Construction will occur in phases, beginning in Fall / Winter 2016 through 2020. 


